Pipes are inspected with catch basins. Discussed reporting treatment swales as conveyance swales. Recommend including a comment on reports that all structures are inspected during the reported inspection. Weir inspections may be recorded with pump station inspections. Did not see erosion and sediment control in the portal; however, in the past, Rebecca has received permit holds requiring on silt fence repairs. Before closure order, the City must receive a signed and sealed document for post-construction compliance. Recommend collecting the number of active construction sites and inspections for ESC within the Town performed the City of Delray Beach. Rebecca reviewed permits, 38 permits for pools, additions, other small projects that require dirt turning. Enforcement: City of Delray Beach provided a letter that stated no violations.
