








Do Your Part: Don't Contribute to Aggressive Driving

More than 1,500 people die in traffic accidents involving aggressive driving every year. A study by the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety reports that 56 percent of all fatal traffic accidents stem from aggressive driving. Speeding, tailgating, not using your turn signal when changing lanes, cutting off other vehicles, expressing your frustration through the use of your horn, language or gestures all constitute aggressive driving.

When you're driving, remember that it isn't a race or a competition and it isn't about ego or toughness. It's your responsibility to do your part to keep roadways safe. Keep cool, calm and collected at all times when driving and don't contribute to road rage or aggressive driving. Also remember to always:

- Give yourself enough time to get to where you are going safely
- Leave enough room between your vehicle and those around you. Don't tailgate!
- Exercise patience and courtesy. Be kind and understanding and remember to respectfully share the road.
- Pay attention! Keep mobile devices out of sight so they aren't a distraction.
- Keep your cool even if someone does something on the road that frustrates you. Be patient and refrain from engaging other drivers with angry language or gestures.
- Drive at safe speeds and remember to adjust accordingly for weather and traffic conditions.
